Depending on the COVID 19 status in March, we may still be doing virtual classes. When we are able to meet in person, we will be meeting at the Mentor Public Library, Main Campus.

Each session will consist of a short presentation followed by interactive demonstrations and/or discussions. When appropriate to the topic, small groups of participants will work with a Lake County Master Gardener Volunteer on a project.

Directions to Mentor Public Library:

Via Route 2 (East or West)

Exit at Route 615 (exit # 217). From the east take a left at the end of the ramp; from the west take a right. Drive south on 615/Center Street. At Mentor Avenue/Rt. 20 turn right. In about 1/2 mile the Library will be on your right.

Via Route 90 (East or West)

Exit at Route 615 (exit 195). From the East turn right onto 615/Center Street. From the West turn left onto 615/Center Street. Drive north until you reach Mentor Avenue/Rt. 20. Turn left. In about 1/2 mile the Library will be on your right.

Saturday March 13, 2021 at 10:00 AM

Nature's Cues a.k.a. Phenology – Would you like an accurate way to predict when a particular insect is apt to invade your yard or know when your lilacs will bloom? Learn what growing degree-days (GDDs) are and, while not perfect, why they are a more reliable method of predicting plant and insect development than calendar days.

Victory Gardens in 2021 – Create Victory over your fears and improve your health by starting a Victory Garden. We will define Victory Gardens, learn about their history, and explore best practices for starting a vegetable producing Victory Garden.

Fall Vegetable Gardening – Don't abandon your veg garden just because the tomato production is waning. There is still lots to do in the garden. With a little planning, you can harvest well into winter. But, if you are done, there is still preparation to make next year's garden even better. Let's explore how to extend your season through protection and planting schedules as well as what to do now to have a better garden next year.

Best Fall Flowers – Discover and explore the variety of fall flowers for your landscape. Learn how to best select, plant and store fall flowers such as Dahlias, Cannas and Gladiolas.

Holiday Flowers – Selecting your Holiday plants is just as important as learning how to care for them once you have them home. Learning how to get them to rebloom will also be discussed.
